The Sakura Project planted a total of 3082 trees in Ontario, from the year 2000 to 2012, and 2022 marks the 10th anniversary of the Project's conclusion. The Project was spearheaded by the Consulate-General of Japan in Toronto, and the trees were donated as symbols of friendship and cordial relations between Japan and Canada.

This booklet is a collection of photos from Ontario cities, organizations, schools and more, that have received Sakura trees for the Sakura Project, and that have maintained the care of these trees so that their blooms can be enjoyed by the people of Ontario each year. 


Message from Consul-General of Japan SASAYAMA Takuya


YORK UNIVERSITY KINSMEN BUILDING, CALUMET RESIDENCE, TAIT MCKENZIE CENRE




